

# **Student Services**

- 160 South Dallas students impacted by our programming
  - 84 youth attending BridgeBuilders Out-of-School Program
- 46% are committed to building relationship with BridgeBuilders
- 76 teens attending BridgeBuilders Out-of-School Program

  5.1% are committed to building relationship with BridgeBuilders
- 54% are committed to building relationship with BridgeBuilders

We estimate that 2023 provided 24,000 touchpoints with students that are building relationships with BridgeBuilders through their visits and time in the program.

# **66** South Dallas athletes involved in our sports programs



- 25 athletes involved our partner basketball program
- 24 athletes involved in our Bonton Girls Run program
- 17 athletes involved in our partner volleyball program

Outside of our student programs, there are 55 unique relationships we are building with other youth and teens in Bonton+Ideal.

# A Place-Based Partnership

BridgeBuilders is a place-based organization. Our guiding focus is our Bonton+Ideal neighbors that have been here for years, creating a vibrant community together. When we asked them how we could play a specific part in the growth of the neighborhood, the top suggestion was a grocery store— a market with access to free and nutritious food in the middle of Dallas's food desert. Responding to their ask resulted in a partnership with Brother Bill's Helping Hand to make the South Dallas Community Market come to fruition, but it also cemented our commitment to partnership with our neighbors.

South Dallas has less access to food than it deserves, and the food available is often less nutritional than they deserve. These neighbors have proven their grit and determination to thrive in this place, and this Market stands as a testament to their self-built culture amid adversity— a culture of welcoming. Some folks come to the Market simply to grab a cup of coffee and say hello, because they are actively seeking neighbors to take part in hope-filled and fun activities.

To put it another way, this place has become a home to hope. We get to be a part of that because our neighbors welcome us! When we spend our time learning about the people who built the place we love, we deepen our love for the place itself. The South Dallas Community Market builds up its hometown, and its neighbors, because it has been built by their influence.
